Student Project

Start with a company

Start from a company or organisation working with relevant challenges within energy systems. Once a project idea has been defined, a suitable academic supervisor can be identified. The programme director can assist if needed.

Reach out to a teacher

Contact a teacher or researcher, you have previously experienced and who is active in a field that interests you. Many projects originate from ongoing research activities.

Join the department's Project Day

Participate in the annual DTU Wind and Energy Systems Project Day, held every October. At this event, companies present proposed thesis projects. You'll find the project catalogue [here](#). The majority of projects are offered at MSc level; however, you also can find a number of relevant BSc projects.
